& 7 PM, in Spanish.

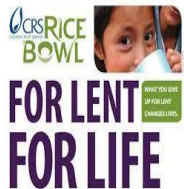
On April 8<sup>th</sup> – Art Slouka, will lead the Stations of the Cross for the Lectors/Readers.

The cost of educating just one seminarian is over \$50,000. Your investment in the future of the priesthood is greatly needed to help guarantee the growth of the Catholic faith in East Tennessee. Please be generous in supporting our Diocesan Seminarians in their formation as they endeavor, through the grace of God, to become your future priests.
