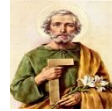

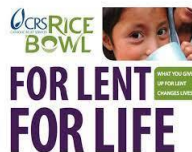
noon. Come and visit Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is waiting for you!

On Good Friday, April 15, 2022 a Pontifical Collection will be taken for the Holy Land for those pastoral, charitable, educational and social works which the Church supports in the Holy Land for the welfare of their Christian brethren and the local communities.
