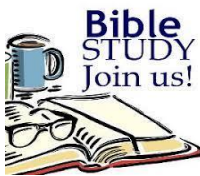

noon. Come and visit Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is waiting for you!



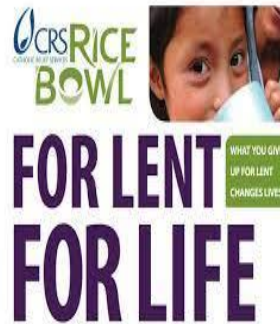
FAT TUESDAY – Back by popular demand, the Knights of Columbus will have authentic *Louisiana Cajun*
