**Cardinal Cantalamessa:
The Church must bear
Christ for our world:** The
Preacher of the Papal
Household, Cardinal Raniero
Cantalamessa, delivered his

third Advent sermon to the Pope and the Roman Curia, and reflected on Jesus' birth "of a woman" and what that means for the Church's mission to preach Christ.

Cardinal Raniero Cantalamessa said: "When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman." He took this line from Paul's Letter to the Galatians as the basis of his reflection for the third Advent Sermon on Friday, which saw Pope Francis and various officials of the Roman Curia take part.

The Preacher of the Papal Household focused especially on the implications of the phrase: "born of a woman." He noted with the Fathers of the Church that, without those words, Christ would appear as "a heavenly, disembodied illusion", an image of Christ which the Docetist heresy sought to promote.

Being born "of a woman" and in the flesh is "clear proof of his human nature," said the Cardinal with St. Leo the Great.
